As we move into a new decade, we are delighted to be able to celebrate the successes that Family Nurse Partnership has brought to Scotland over the previous 10 years. It is hard to think back that far, but we are sure that each and every one of you will see and feel in everything you do how much FNP and your work has changed the early years landscape in Scotland.

In 2010 we had:

150 active families 6 Family Nurses 1 Family Nurse Supervisor 1 Data Manager

In 2019 we have:

7,300 families received the programme 3,500 families graduated from the programme 2,800 active families 155 wte Family Nurses 29 wte Family Nurse Supervisors 25 Data Managers (and 13 admin assistants)

Our engagement on the programme remains consistently high and our attrition rate consistently low, helping Scotland stand out, internationally, as one of the highest performing countries in the world for this programme. It is with heartfelt thanks to you and those around you who have made Family Nurse Partnership in Scotland a success, and we look forward to celebrating another 10 years together.

BREASTFEEDING SUCCESS

For the third year in a row we have seen breastfeeding initiation and duration rising with 9 % percent of FNP babies being exclusively breastfed at 6-8 weeks, and over 13% receiving any breastmilk. This is a great achievement and means we are continuing to support women to breastfeed as the normal nutrition for babies.

FNP 'TO THE MOON AND **BACK' WALKING CHALLENGE**

Thank you to everyone who took part in the last FNP 'to the moon and back' walking challenge. We walked a total of 13,305,197 steps and 5,669 miles (equivalent to walking 92% of the coastline of mainland Scotland)

NEW PROCESSES

Most of you will be aware that we have developed a new RICE (Request for Change, Issue, Commission and Exceptions) log. This is to improve communication, information flow and completion of agreed outputs. Outputs form these will include Short Life Working Groups, Virtual interactions (with the new Knowledge Hub Shared Platform being put in place) and other mechanisms, bringing in a range of people over the required period to really drive some of this work to conclusion and identify next steps.
